†BI110 – BIBLE STUDY METHODS 3 HOURS

This course is an introduction to various, proven methods of Bible study. Emphasis will be placed on developing the student's ability to study the Scriptures independently of commentaries and using these various study methods as tools for personal study.

†BI111 – OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY Part 1 3 HOURS

This course is an overview of the historical books (Genesis through Esther) of the Old Testament, relating individual books in the Old Testament to the whole, giving leading facts, principle teachings, key words, key verses and an outline of each book in the Old Testament.

†BI116 – NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY 3 HOURS

This course is an overview of the books of the New Testament, relating individual books in the New Testament to the whole, giving leading facts, principle teachings, key words, key verses and an outline of each book in the New Testament. BI331 – DANIEL and REVELATION 3 HOURS

BL231A – BIBLICAL GREEK Part 1 2 HOURS

This course is an introduction to elementary grammar and basic vocabulary of Koine Greek, including the reading of progressively more complex passages from the Greek New Testament. (Prerequisite: English proficiency at or beyond the GE112 level; concurrent enrolment in GE112 is acceptable.)

†GE110 – BIBLICAL LIVING and WORLDVIEW 3 HOURS

This course is a systematic analysis of the Biblical lifestyle of discipleship. Each student is encouraged to develop a Biblical worldview and be able to think accurately about the different issues facing the present-day believer.

†GE111 – ENGLISH GRAMMAR 3 HOURS

This course studies the structure of the English language, reviewing the parts of speech and analyzing how to combine them into grammatically correct phrases, clauses, and sentences with correct punctuation.

MN244 – BIBLICAL COUNSELING 3 HOURS

This course is an introductory study of the basic approach to counseling that effects a biblical change. An examination of the biblical model as it compares with modern psychological trends will be covered. Attention will be given to discovering basic principles of human nature, steps for finding Biblical solutions, how to ask critical questions, and how to proceed with a counseling session, both formally and informally.

MN434 – MISSIONAL CHURCH PLANTING Part 1 2 HOURS

This course is a practical study of church planting, emphasizing the biblical basis and New Testament patterns, as well as modern practices and methodology. This first of three courses is designed to introduce the student to the missional church that seeks to intentionally plant churches in the areas surrounding it.

MN447 - MANAGING MONEY IN THE MINISTRY 3 HOURS

This course presents a biblical approach to personal money management. †TH220 – DOCTRINES OF BIBLE, GOD, and HOLY SPIRIT 3 HOURS

This course acquaints the student to a systematic theological study of Bibliology (the study of the Bible), Theology Proper (the study of God), and Pneumatology (the study of the Holy Spirit). These doctrines will be examined from the standpoint of their Biblical origin, and the student will be introduced to the theological terms that have been assigned to each doctrine.

TH330 – CULTS and WORLD RELIGIONS 3 HOURS

This course studies the major world ethnic religions and the principle American cults. Comparisons are made between their doctrinal tenets and those of revealed biblical truth. The practical concern of this course is to help the student discern truth from error in religious systems and to effectively teach and witness with an adequate understanding of pagan and cultic theology.
