### **\*BI111 – Old Testament Survey Part 1 (1hr)**

This course is an overview of the historical books (Genesis through Esther) of the Old Testament, relating individual books in the Old Testament to the whole, giving leading facts, principle teachings, key words, key verses and an outline of each book in the Old Testament.

### **BI132 – Biblical Geography (2hr)**

This course presents a detailed analysis of the geography of the Bible. The characteristics of the land will be examined in a chronological study of the Bible, including ancient Palestine, the life of Christ and the travels of Paul. Particular attention will be placed on the influence of the land in relation to the events that occurred. Emphasis will be placed on basic map reading and making.

### **†BI220 – Life of Christ (3hr)**

This course is a study of the earthly life of Christ as revealed in the four Gospels. Special attention will be given to the synoptic problem and the harmony of the Gospels. This study will examine the individual events of His life (in chronological order) to see how they contributed to His overall purpose in coming.

### **BI238 – Acts (2hr)**

This course is designed to present a detailed analysis of the book of Acts. The foundation and early development of the Church will be examined, and particular attention will be given to the transition from Israel to the Church. Special attention will also be given to the development of the basic content of the book, the theological content, and the historical setting, along with practical insights for Christian living.

### **\*BI249 – Biblical Interpretation (3hr)**

This course equips the student with proper and sound rules of biblical interpretation. Special, detailed attention will be given to the instruction and practice of the fundamental principles of the literal, historical, cultural, grammatical method of biblical interpretation.

### **BI334 – Romans (3hr)**

This course teaches the basic doctrines of the Book of Romans. This book is an important foundation for the message of grace that was revealed through the Apostle Paul. The basic doctrines of the righteous judgment of God, redemption through the death of Christ, justification by faith without works, and deliverance from the bondage of sin will be analyzed.

### **BL231B – Biblical Greek 2 (2hr)**

This course builds upon the foundation laid in BL231A. This study completes the basic survey of elementary Greek grammar and includes the reading of the text of 1 John.

### **CM101 – Principles and Practices of Prayer (1hr)**

This course introduces the student to the importance, power, and effectiveness of prayer. Principles for daily prayer life and practices of an active prayer life for the believer will be examined.

### **\*CM112 – Introduction to World Missions (2hr)**

This is a course in the fundamentals of missions designed to remove misunderstandings, establish scriptural principles, investigate problems, and excite interest in world missions. It includes a study of the meaning and purpose of missions, the Biblical basis and theological reason for the mission enterprise, an introduction to the divinely-ordained missions agencies and human instruments.

### **CM211 – Women in Ministry (2hr)**

This course is an overview of the opportunities available to women in various Christian ministries. Special consideration will be given to problems, resources, and proper attitudes in women's ministries.

### **‡CM221 – Biblical Teaching (3hr)**

This course is a study of teaching methods, materials, and media with emphasis on the sound principles of instruction, the writing of objectives for teaching, the preparation of lesson plans, and the use of audio visual aids.

### **‡CM231 – Biblical Communication (3hr)**

This is an introductory course for men and women designed to give the student instruction in the basics of Biblical message preparation and presentation. This course will prepare the student to publicly speak the truth of God's Word. This course includes instruction in research, structure, and preparation of a message with opportunities for speaking in class.

### **\*CM244 – Biblical Counseling (3hr)**

This course is an introductory study of the basic approach to counseling that effects a Biblical change. An examination of the Biblical model as it compares with modern psychological trends will be covered. Attention will be given to discovering basic principles of human nature.

### **\*GE112 – English Composition (3hr)**

This course builds on GE111 and further develops the student's skills in composition and written expression with an emphasis on clarity and precision. The composition and style of the research paper will form the framework of the class, as students practice descriptive narrative, critical, persuasive and expository writing.

### **\*GE232 – Western Civilization (Modern) (3hr)**

This course surveys the political, economic, spiritual, and intellectual experiments of western man from the Reformation to the present, emphasizing the impact of the church upon the landscape of the western world. The most important persons, problems, decisions, and developments will be traced.

### **\*TH224 – Doctrines of Angels and Holy Spirit (2hr)**

This course acquaints the student to a systematic theological study of Angelology (the study of angels), and Pneumatology (the study of the Holy Spirit). These doctrines will be examined from the standpoint of their Biblical origin, and the student will be introduced to the theological terms that have been assigned to each doctrine.

### **\*TH226 – Doctrines of Church and End Times (2hr)**

This course acquaints the student to a systematic theological study of Ecclesiology (the study of the church), and Eschatology (the study of last things). These doctrines will be examined from the standpoint of their Biblical origin, and the student will be introduced to the theological terms that have been assigned to each doctrine.

### **TH331 – Cults and World Religions (2hr)**

This course studies the major world ethnic religions and the principle American cults. Comparisons are made between their doctrinal tenets and those of revealed biblical truth. The practical concern of this course is to help the student discern truth from error in religious systems and to effectively teach and witness with an adequate understanding of pagan and cultic theology.
